- Standard Assessment Tests
- All year 6 children in state schools
- 6 tests over four days
- Tested in Reading, Maths and SPaG / GPS (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar)



When are SATs happening?

- Monday 12th – Thursday 15th May (a few weeks after the Easter holiday)

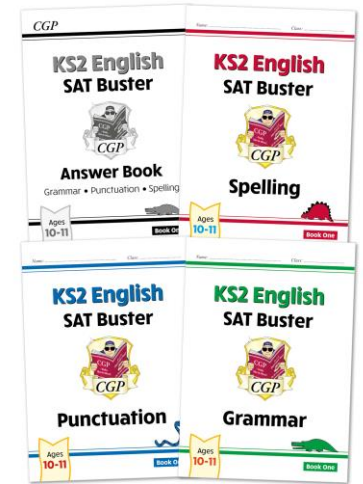
How to prepare children for SATs

 - Doesn't affect places at secondary schools
- Other than this, individual scores are not published



What are our expectations of the children?

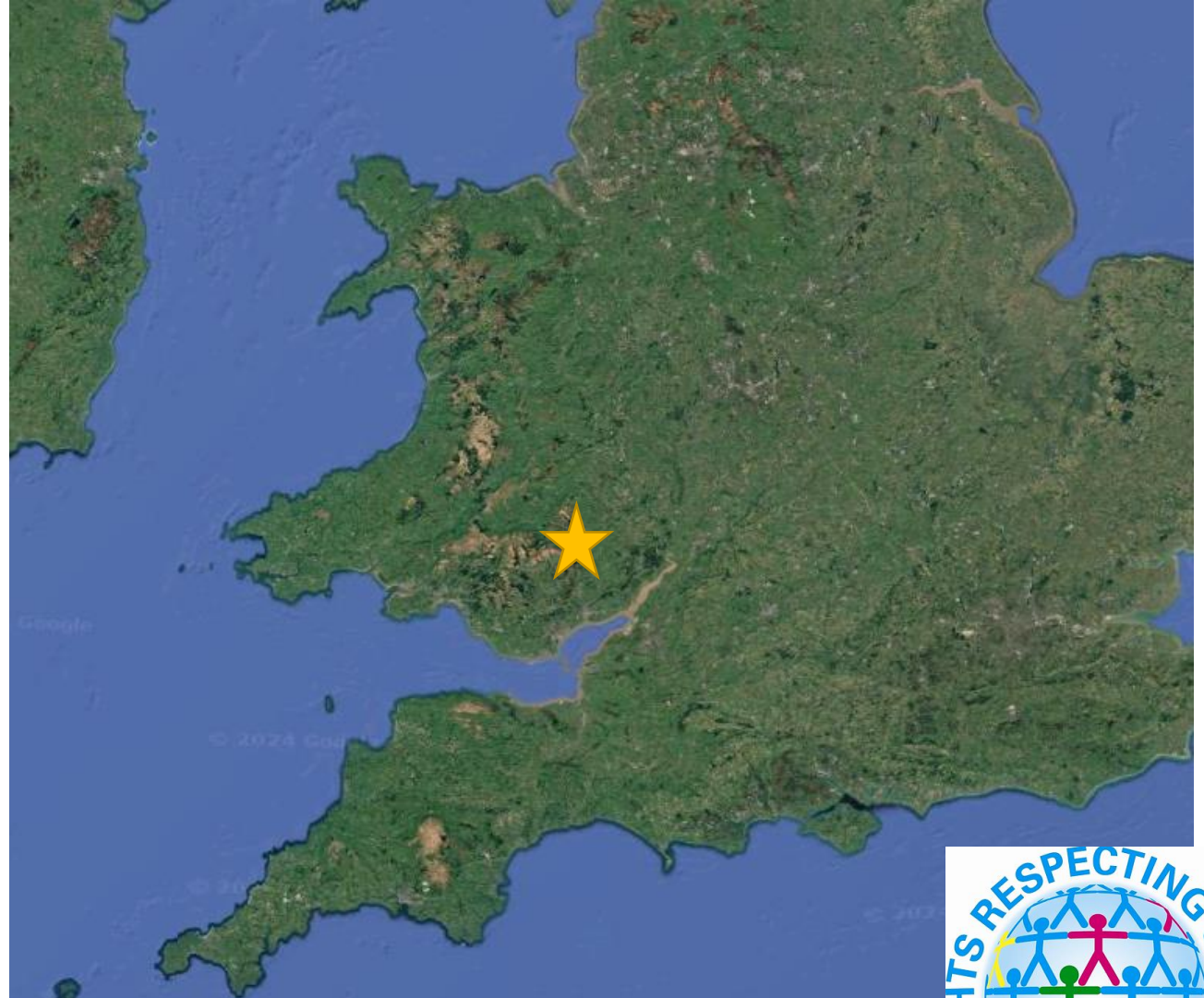
- Effort over outcome
